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


The Global Initiative for West, Central and Southern Africa

- Launch of the Project in 2006 in the framework of the Global Initiative (GI) launched in 1996

 INTERNATIONAL MARITIME ORGANIZATION

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- Cooperation with the oil and gas sector in line with the OPRC 90 convention
- **Objective**: enhance the capacity of 22 partner countries to prepare for and respond to oil spills, so that they can better protect their marine and coastal
- environment
- Technical assistance:
 - National or sub-regional workshops,
 - Trainings (tailored to the needs),
 - Exercises (table-top and deployment),
 - Biennial conferences



In a nutshell

A **joint endeavour** of the public and private sectors to manage oil spill risks and mitigate associated impacts.

Encourages partner countries to ratify and implement international conventions from IMO and other UN bodies.



Encourages better communication and collaboration between governments and industry.

partner countries in the development and implementation of subregional and national oil spill preparedness and response systems.

Supports 22 African

Maintains a constant liaison with partner countries and the industry to provide tailored capacitybuilding solutions.

Organizes workshops, training courses and exercises.
